  - a. Press release put out by Mayor 10/17/2017
  - b. Ben Turner was interviewed today by local media

    - ii. Form committee/task force

3. ALAC Membership Update
  - a. Tameshia Harris was recently appointed to the committee
  - b. Andy Wessel was reappointed.
4. Review of Action Areas
  - a. Reviewed progress on action items identified in previous meetings
  - b. Discussion that air quality is outside of the scope of ALAC
  - c. City now has a spot on the website to request bicycle parking
  - d. Bike parking budget increased in CIP starting next year
  - e. Access Forum coming up to discuss walkability

- i. Soon, hopeful that walk audits become linked to philanthropic and city grant project selection.
  - f. Mountain Bike Park
    - i. Ben Turner attended a meeting with bike park advocates and representatives from the Parks Department, including Director Bench, arranged through ALAC
    - ii. High competition for space at Tranquility Park
    - iii. Park at 108<sup>th</sup> and Maple also an option
    - iv. Next steps will not involve ALAC
  - g. Parking benefit districts making progress
  - h. Have succeeded in becoming Vision Zero City
  - i. Performance measures
    - i. Still need to pursue report
    - ii. Tie into Complete Streets performance measure report
  - j. Focus for near-term will be Vision Zero
  - k. Opportunity to tie into BRT project with other transit goals?
    - i. Still working out details of final design, so unclear of actual final costs
    - ii. Role for discussion of health benefits of transit use
    - iii. Consider bringing representatives from MAPA to discuss Close the Gap or Metro to discuss overall transit issues in area
